DAOES, an Illinois Career and Technical Education (CTE) system, has two major functions: planning for the delivery of CTE for a geographical area in Chicago's western

suburbs, and operating the Technology Center of DuPage (TCD), a Career & Technical Education center for 11th & 12th graders.

Located in Addison, Illinois, about 20 miles west of Chicago, DAOES provides services to schools and accepts enrollment from 14 high achieving school districts in the DuPage County area. DAOES serves students in the same geographical area as the College of DuPage. The System provides Career & Technical Education support to over 50,000 9-12 graders and more than 5,000 certified high school staff.

DuPage County is culturally diverse with about 3.1% African American, 9% Hispanic, 7.9% Asian, and 78.7% white. TCD enrollment of 1315 reflects this diversity. The cultural richness of the student population is an advantage for all students and staff.



Technology Center of DuPage



Students from participating schools can choose from 21 career interests and options offered at TCD. More than 200 industry employees serve on

TCD program advisory committees to provide input and advice on current industry trends.

Students attending TCD receive education in the core subjects at the home school and spend one half of each day at TCD.

Through the support of the core subject specialists, work-based learning coordinator, and special needs resource teacher, students and staff are provided with services in the areas of math, science, communication, and workplace skills.

Programs are supported by an excellent technology infrastructure that includes a 1 gigabit fiber optic backbone that links a fully "switched" network of over 300 computers running at 100 megabits/sec., a wireless network throughout the building running at 11 megabits/sec., and a fully dedicated "T1" connection for Internet access.
